## HYBRID WORSHIP

### MASKS IN-PERSON

Most of us live with the hope and a belief that our lives represent the kin-dom of God. We want the evidence to point to a faith that is true and shows that our God is at work in the world. In other words, **we** are now the epiphany, the light shining forth for the world to see. And of course, we will fail from time to time. But how we deal with failure is also a sign of that presence and glimpse of the kin-dom. Following on the heels of the celebration of the Epiphany, we arrive at what is called "ordinary time" and it can be extra-ordinary in the living of it. Let us embrace the call with grace and with joy.



**Sunday, January 1, 2023 - "What Comes After?"** We explore Epiphany and how the "revealing" can continue to past all of the highs and lows of the events of Advent and Christmas- and what does it have to do with all those New Year resolutions?



**Sunday, January 8, "Water and Word"** Living in the kin-dom of God lived out in concrete ways within the body of Christ. So, this week is the promise to be that example, to claim that grace and gift, and to embrace the responsibility of being the church in the world right now. The kin-dom is not a someday thing; it is a today thing and we are committing ourselves to that vision right here and right now



**January 15, "Be Called, Be Named, and Be Restored"** In behavioral therapy there is a phrase often used: "Name it, claim it, tame it" which It refers to being able to identify or name our challenges, emotions, weaknesses or faults; claim them or accept them as our own; and taming them by learning to live with them, overcome them or transform them. But here Isaiah tells is that God calls and names unlikely servants and, perhaps more importantly, those servants often do not recognize themselves as agents of restoration.



**January 22, "Do Justice, Love Kindness, Walk Humbly"**

Prof. & theologian John Collins calls this text "biblical ethics in a nutshell."

Do justice—not a state, but an action.

Love kindness—without loving kindness, justice is incomplete.

Walk humbly—or **reverently** with God (includes a mindfulness of God's attentions and works and of the affirmation that one bears responsibility for

one's actions in life.



**January 29, "Blessed"** What if, instead of the Ten Commandments, we placed the Beatitudes in Court houses? Of course, that wouldn't be right -- because it's a place of law, and the Beatitudes are all about grace.

**DIACONATE** "Deacons" are no longer an elected position for the Church.

**All Actively Participating Members are invited to volunteer as a Deacon.** The meaning of the original Greek word "diakonos" has been variously translated in the New Testament as "one who serves" or "gives support." Our Deacons are authorized for the ministration of baptism and the Lord's Supper (preparing the elements for the Table) in the conduct of worship, and in the pastoral care and spiritual leadership of the congregation. The diaconate is a voluntary ministry.

**IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO ASSIST IN THIS MINISTRY, PLEASE VISIT THE SIGNUP GENIUS** to select a Sunday to serve.

**CHURCH TRUSTEES** hold title to the property of the Congregation, and at the direction of the Congregation or Official Board, as appropriate, act as legal agents on behalf of the Congregation in the acquisition and disposal of real property, the incurring of debt, and other legal matters of a similar nature. They shall see that the property is adequately insured and the financial officers properly bonded. They shall also perform duties as are required by law in regard to properties of the Church, acting as corporate officers when appropriate.

The Permanent Endowment Trustees are generally responsible for...

- Organizing, promoting and encouraging a type of Legacy Society that honors those who have included a gift to the church in their individual legacy/end-of-life plans;
- Sponsoring inheritance planning seminars and other informational meetings dealing with legacy giving;
- Publicizing the fund, including preparing a written report at least annually to the congregation about new gifts received, amount spent for ministry and investment transactions;
- Maintaining permanent files that

- preserve the original gift/bequest language for all separately recorded (restricted) gifts and any major investment additions to the congregationally governed endowment fund;
- Investing endowment assets with an appropriate investment manager and reviewing endowment activity at least quarterly;
- Determining the appropriate distribution for ministry in accordance with donor restrictions, state law or congregational policy.
